Congratulations to the four riders who made it happen! Mario Deslauriers, Eryn Ballard, John Pearce, and of course Ian Millar.

They said that the field was light, and if Canada had a chance, this was the year for them to do it, and they did it "In Style"

It was probably one of the best Nation's Cups in Spruce Meadows history. Most teams were riding second and third string horses, but because of this, the drama was high. It came down to two teams....Great Britain and Canada were both tied after two rounds with ten faults, and a jump off was necessary to decide the victor.

It came down to the anchor riders of both teams to dual it out in a jump off. Ian was first to go on In Style. He completed the course with 4 faults at the third jump with a quick time of 45.888 seconds. Michael entered the stadium in front of 40,000+ fans that were all biting their nails. If he was clean, Canada would be denied victory on their own turf for a 31st consecutive year, and to the crowds pleasure Michael had 8 faults.
